- for soldiers, who prepare for war while praying for peace, that we may deter our enemies from aggression;

- for private groups working to help Americans, the Afghanis who worked with us, women in the police or in government or schools escape from Afghanistan before they are murdered by the Taliban; blessings God gives us in the world around us.

- for an end to the suffering of the people of Ukraine, and for an end to dictatorships everywhere and for peace;
- for the healing of people injured this week in the subway shooting in New York;
- for the restoration to wholeness of those whose homes or businesses were destroyed in this week's spring storms in the south and Midwest;
- for the families, friends, and co-workers of the 101 police officers killed doing their jobs so far this year in this country, including Officer Lebo in Lebanon;
- for the renewal of faith, that civility and respect for human life and dignity may be restored to our land;

- for the family and friends of people murdered or injured in mass shooting events this week;
- for the people of Nigeria, Ethiopia, and the Sudan, facing starvation as a consequence of war or terrorism:
- for the preservation of faith and the protection of all Christians worldwide under attack for their faith:
- for the healing of our brothers and sisters in Christ, including Carol, Frank, Jim, and Ray;
- for the continuing diminishment of covid in all its strains worldwide;
- for the safety and well-beings of our soldiers, sailors, and airmen and women working in disputed areas;
- for families hurt by the impact of inflation on their ability to keep a roof over their heads and food on their tables;
- for the immanent return of our Savior Jesus Christ, that the world may be saved from war, the
 deliberate starvation and imprisonment of ethnic groups like the Uighers, and sin of all kinds;
- for the work of individuals and groups still trying to get American citizens, including children, and vulnerable Afghanis to safety;
